Research Methodology

- *Telephone interviews were conducted with 300 randomly selected voters of the proposed Oak Lodge Community.*
- *An equal number of males (150) and females (150) were interviewed for the survey.*
- *Data was collected May 9 through 21, 2011.*
- *All functions related to the collection, processing and reporting of the survey data were completed in-house by Intercept Research Corporation.*
- *The reliability for a sample of this size is (plus or minus) 5.8% computed at the 95% confidence level.*

Survey Findings

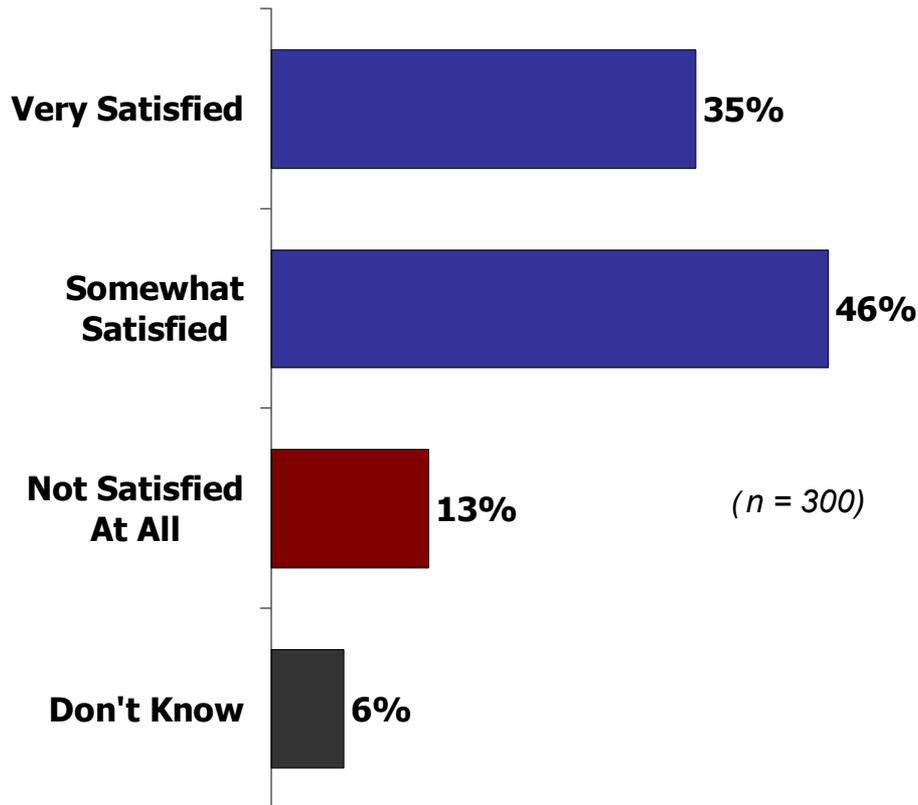
Oak Lodge Livability Features

Question: *What do you think are some of the features of this area that make it an attractive place to live?*

Satisfaction With Growth, Planning and Public Services

Question: *Would you say you are very satisfied, somewhat satisfied, or not satisfied at all with the level of growth, planning and public services in this area?*



- Four out of five (81%) survey respondents are somewhat satisfied (46%) or very satisfied (35%) with the area's level of growth, planning and public services.
 - Respondents under 35 years of age (46%), those earning less than \$50,000 (43%) and those opposed to incorporating the area as a city (42%) are more likely to be very satisfied.
- Only 13% are not satisfied at all.

Primary Reasons for Dissatisfaction With the Area's Level of Growth, Planning and Public Services

Question: *Why are you **not completely satisfied** with the level of growth, planning and public services in this area? (Asked of those responding “somewhat satisfied,” “not satisfied at all” and “don’t know.”)*

Perception of Local Government Oversight

Question: *What local governing body oversees this community?*

Clackamas County/Commissioners	71%
Milwaukie/City/Council/Mayor	8%

Oak Grove/Community Council/Citizen Group	1%
Gladstone/City	1%

- An overwhelming majority (71%) believe Clackamas County is the governing body that oversees the community.
- One out of five residents (20%) is unsure.
 - Particularly those under 35 years of age (38%), those earning less than \$30,000 (30%), renters (29%), those in favor of incorporating (30%) and unlikely voters (28%).

Preference for Future Government Oversight

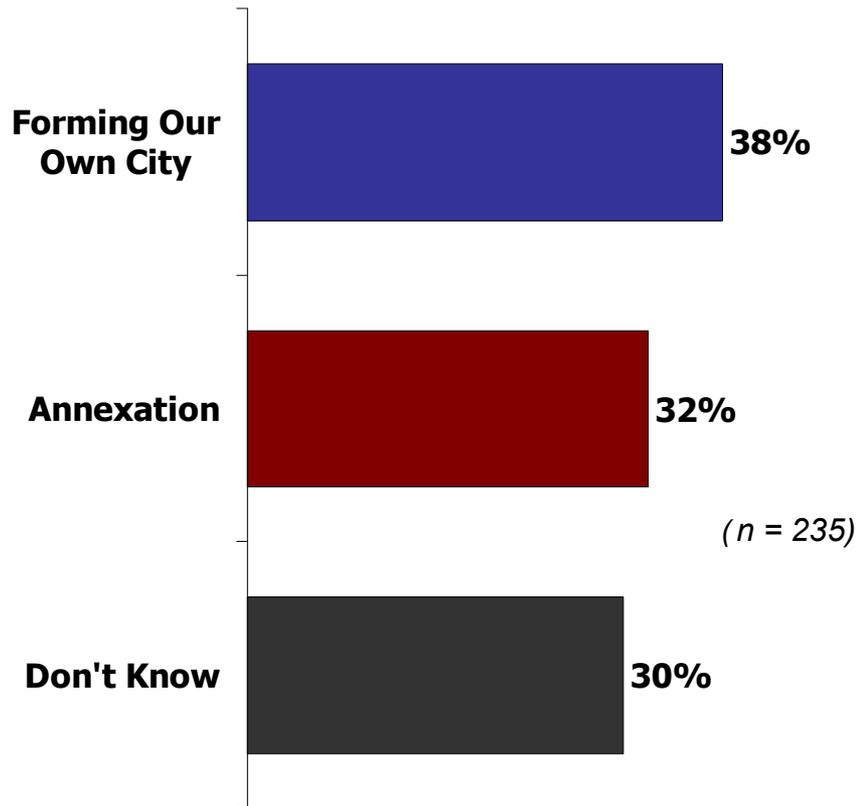
Question: *Residents living in this area will have the opportunity to decide how they will be governed in the future and who will determine issues related to planning, growth and services. Based on what you know or have heard, which of the following would you prefer for the future of this area?*

<i>Aided/Single Response</i>	<i>(n = 300)</i>
Keep the area unincorporated	66%
Annex the area into the city of Milwaukie	10%
Incorporate the area as a city	7%
Annex the area into the city of Gladstone	4%
Don't know	12%

- Two out of three residents (66%) prefer that the area be kept unincorporated.
 - Particularly those with an annual household income of under \$30,000 (76%).
- Fewer than one in 10 (7%) residents support incorporating the area as a city.

Preference for Incorporation or Annexation

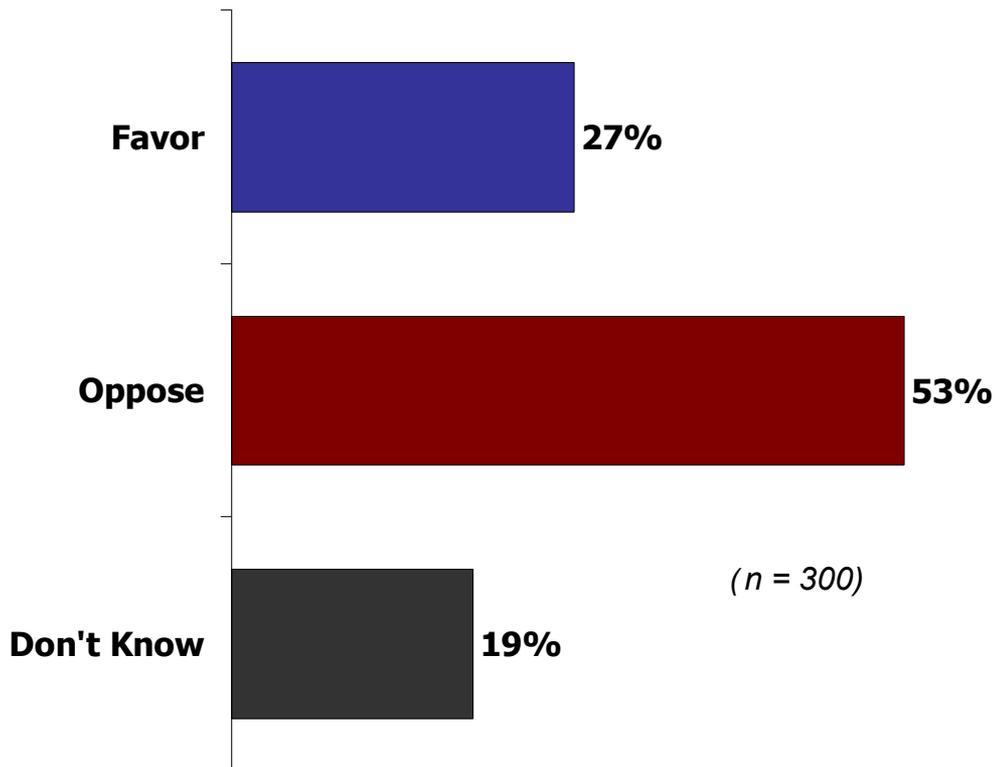
Question: *If you had to choose between annexation into an existing city or forming our own city, which would you prefer? (Asked of those who prefer to keep the area unincorporated and those who are unsure.)*



- Respondents are slightly more likely to prefer forming a city (38%) rather than annexation into an existing city (32%).
 - Respondents under 55 years of age (50%), those with an annual household income of \$30,000 and over (42%) and renters (56%) are more likely to prefer forming a city.
- A significant number (30%) are unsure.

Support for Incorporation

Question: *Some people have suggested that this area should be incorporated as a city in order to improve streets, increase public safety, create local control, improve planning and code enforcement, and control growth. Based on anything you know or may have heard, would you favor or oppose incorporating this area as a city?*



- Residents are twice as likely to oppose (53%) rather than favor (27%) incorporating the area as a city.
 - Respondents under 55 years of age (35%) and renters (39%) and unlikely voters (36%) are more likely to favor incorporating the area as a city.
- Approximately one in five (19%) are undecided.

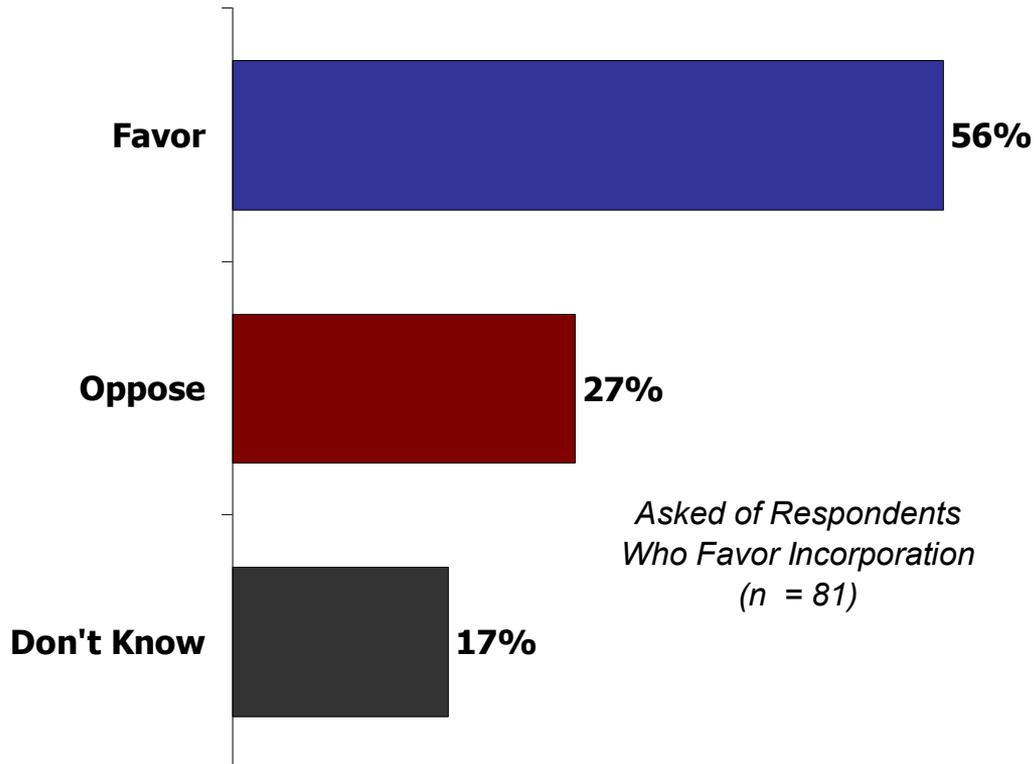
Reasons in Support of Incorporation

Question: *Why do you favor incorporating the area as a city?*

Effect of Establishing a Tax Rate/Property Tax Increase

Question: *Would you still favor incorporating this area as a city if you knew that a permanent tax rate would be established to provide essential services, and that your property tax could increase by one dollar per \$1,000 of assessed value? For example, a home valued at \$100,000 would be assessed an additional \$100 per year in property taxes.*



- Residents who support incorporation are twice as likely to favor (56%) rather than oppose (27%) incorporation knowing that a permanent tax rate would be established.
 - Residents in favor tend to be 35 to 54 years of age (66%), those earning \$50,000 or more (67%) and likely voters (62%).
- Seventeen percent (17%) are undecided.

Reasons for Opposing Incorporation

Question: *Why do you not support incorporating the area as a city?*

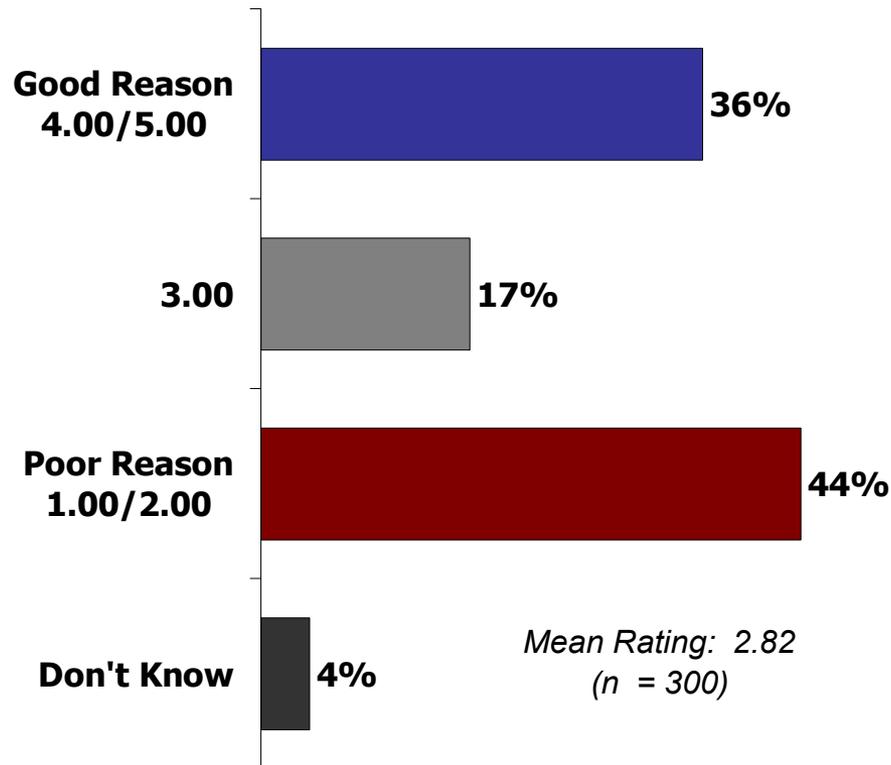
Evaluation of Message Effectiveness

Evaluation of Message Effectiveness *(Continued)*

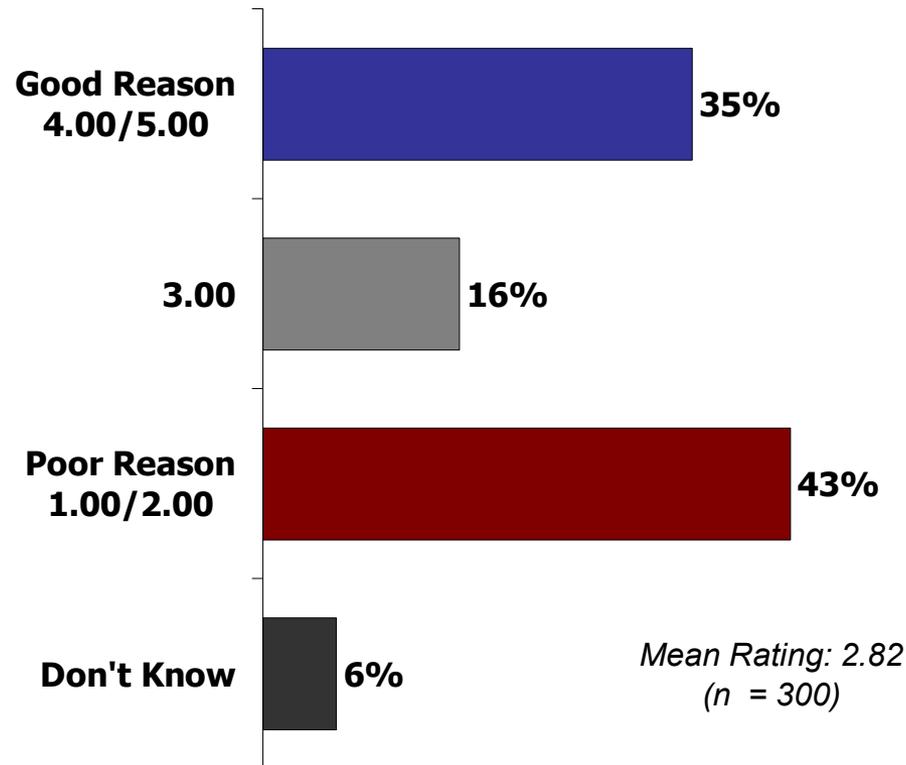
Question: *Incorporating the Oak Lodge area as a city will create a local government with city leaders and officials elected from your neighborhood, directly accountable to voters?*



- Thirty-six percent (36%) believe this is a very good reason (5.00 rating – 22%) or a good reason (4.00 – 14%) to support incorporation.
- Forty-four percent (44%) believe this is a very poor reason (1.00 rating – 32%) or a poor reason (2.00 – 12%) to support incorporation.

Evaluation of Message Effectiveness *(Continued)*

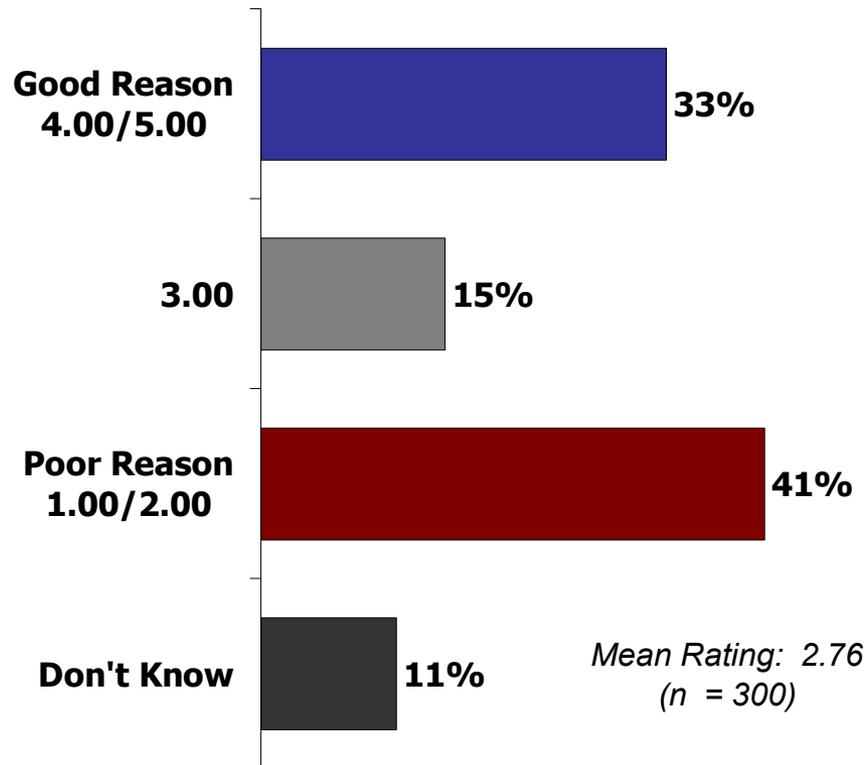
Question: *Incorporating the Oak Lodge area as a city will improve public safety, street maintenance and other essential governmental services?*



- Thirty-five percent (35%) believe this is a very good reason (5.00 rating – 21%) or a good reason (4.00 – 14%) to support incorporation.
- Forty-three percent (43%) believe this is a very poor reason (1.00 rating – 30%) or a poor reason (2.00 – 13%) to support incorporation.

Evaluation of Message Effectiveness *(Continued)*

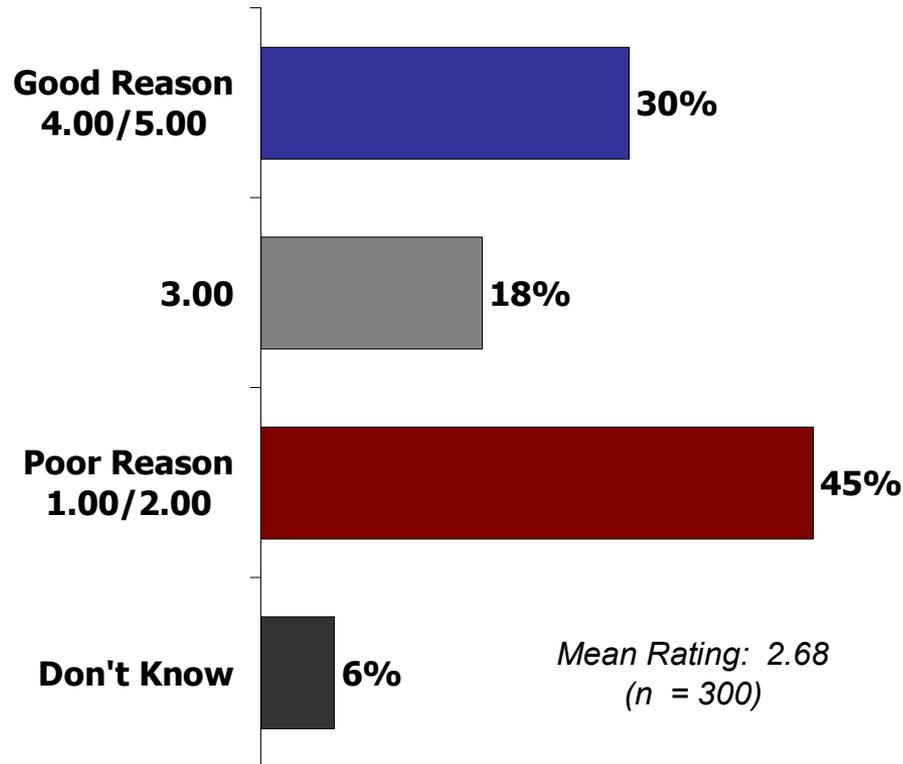
Question: *Incorporating the Oak Lodge area as a city will result in substantial additional money for the community via shared revenues only available to cities?*



- Thirty-three percent (33%) believe this is a very good reason (5.00 rating – 16%) or a good reason (4.00 – 17%) to support incorporation.
- Forty-one percent (41%) believe this is a very poor reason (1.00 rating – 29%) or a poor reason (2.00 – 12%) to support incorporation.

Evaluation of Message Effectiveness *(Continued)*

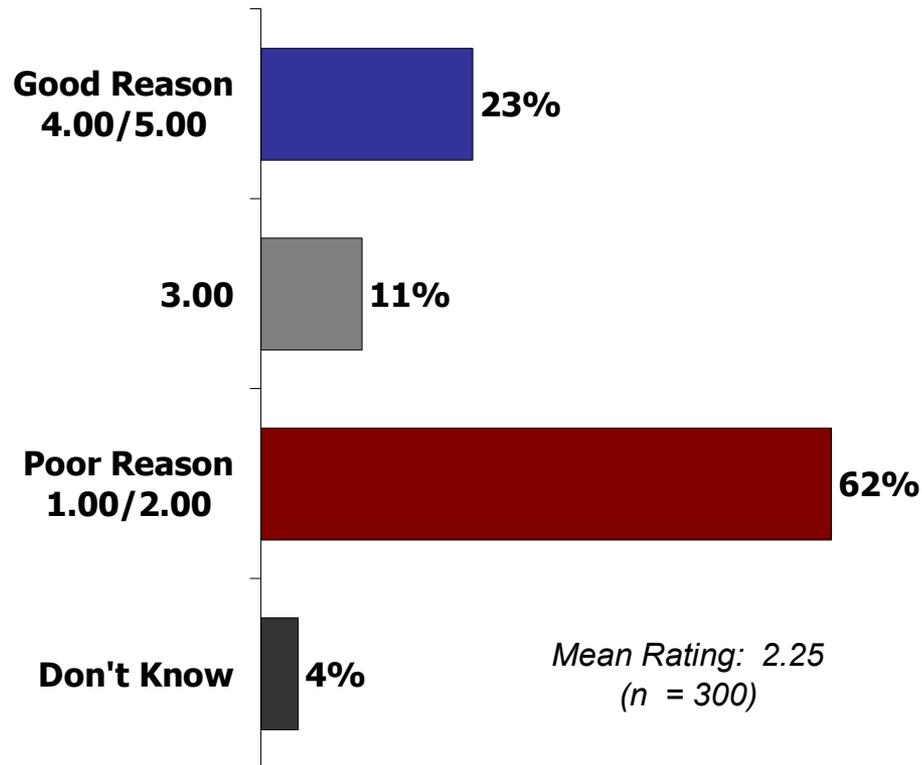
Question: *Incorporating the Oak Lodge area as a city will ensure local control in zoning regulations, building restrictions and code enforcement?*



- Thirty percent (30%) believe this is a very good reason (5.00 rating – 18%) or a good reason (4.00 – 12%) to support incorporation.
- Forty-five percent (45%) believe this is a very poor reason (1.00 rating – 34%) or a poor reason (2.00 – 11%) to support incorporation.

Evaluation of Message Effectiveness *(Continued)*

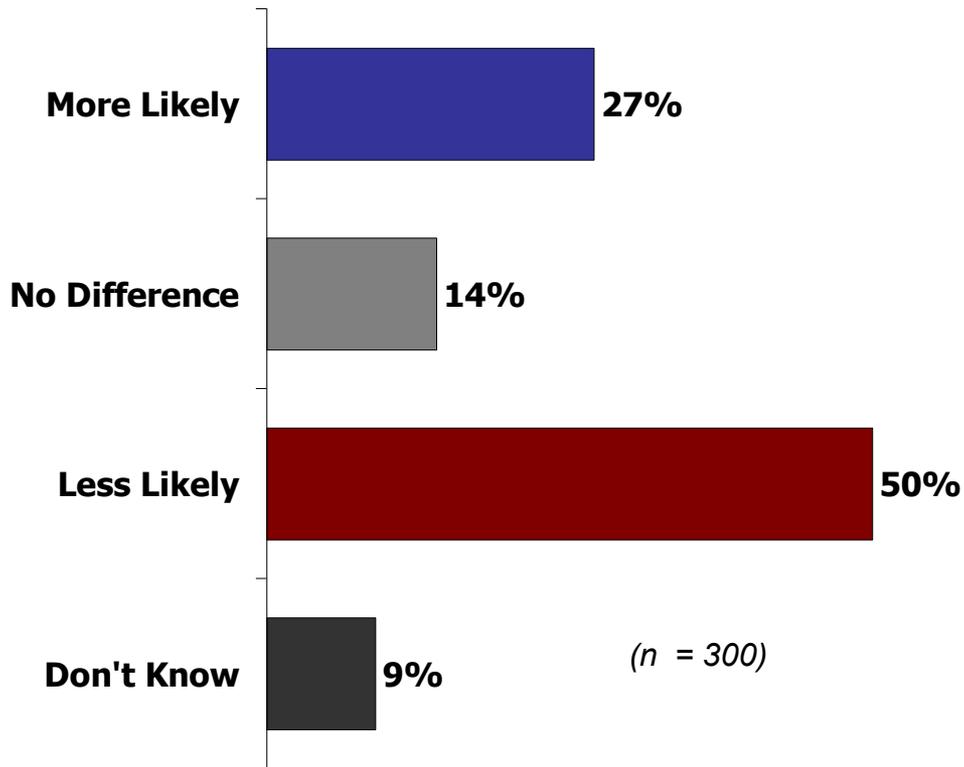
Question: *Incorporating the Oak Lodge area as a city is essential in order to maintain the livability of the community?*



- Twenty-three percent (23%) believe this is a very good reason (5.00 rating – 13%) or a good reason (4.00 – 10%) to support incorporation.
- Sixty-two percent (62%) believe this is a very poor reason (1.00 rating – 46%) or a poor reason (2.00 – 16%) to support incorporation.

Effect of Messages on Support for Incorporation

Question: *After hearing the reasons I have just read, are you more likely or less likely to support incorporating this area as a city?*



- Twenty-seven percent (27%) are more likely to support incorporating the area as a city after hearing messages in support of incorporation.
 - Particularly those under 35 years of age (54%).
- One-half (50%) are less likely to support incorporation after hearing the messages.

Primary Sources of Community Information

Question: *Where do you usually get information about issues affecting your community?*

Word-of-mouth/neighbors/citizens/friends/relatives	36%

Newspaper – <i>Clackamas Review</i>	22%

Direct mail/mailings	5%

- Newspapers are mentioned most often as a source of information about issues affecting the community.
 - Particularly females (75%), those 55 years of age and older (76%), homeowners (71%) and those opposed to incorporation (76%).

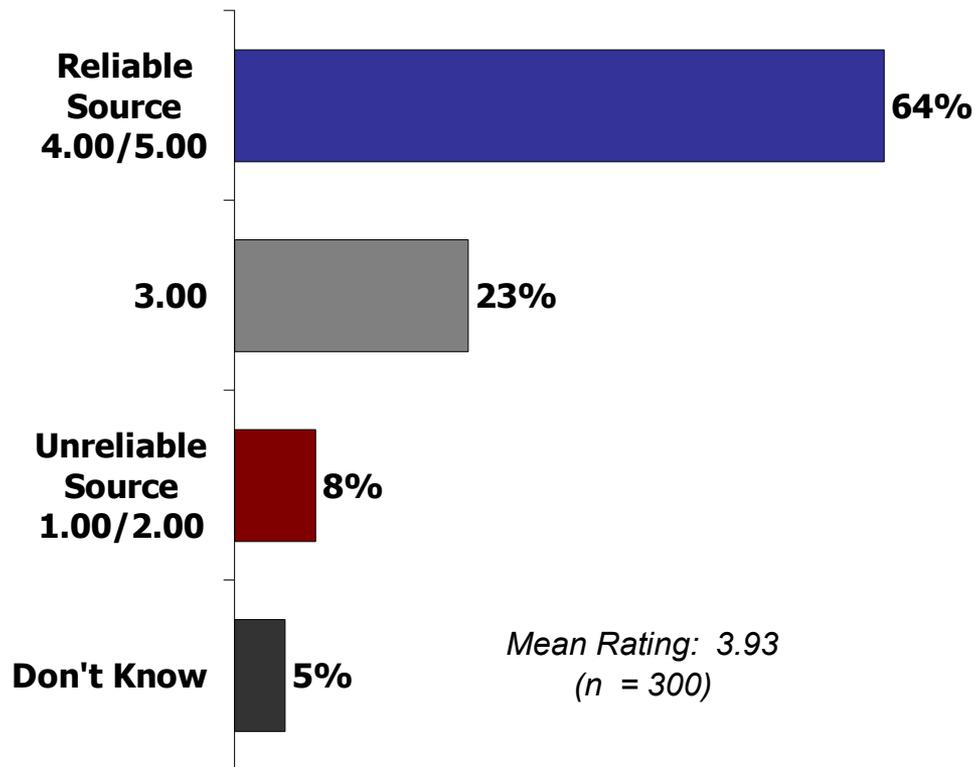
Reliability of Information Sources

Reliability of Information Sources *(Continued)*

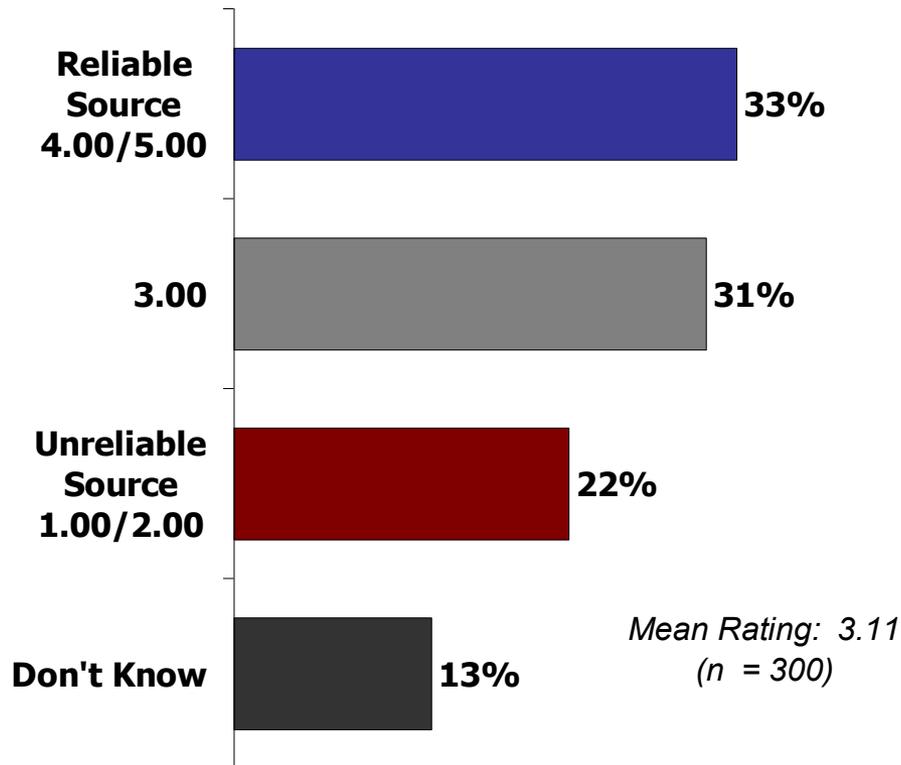
Long-Time Residents of the Oak Lodge Area



- Sixty-four percent (64%) believe this is a very reliable source (5.00 rating – 35%) or a reliable source (4.00 – 29%) of information.
- Eight percent (8%) believe this is a very unreliable source (1.00 rating – 2%) or an unreliable source (2.00 – 6%) of information.

Reliability of Information Sources *(Continued)*

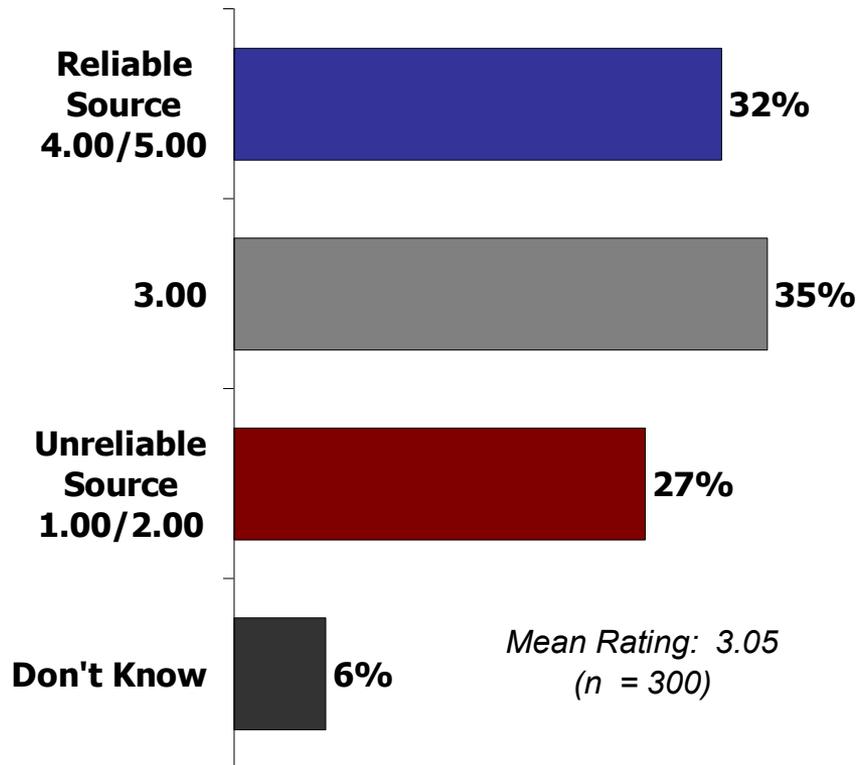
Community Leaders



- Thirty-three percent (33%) believe this is a very reliable source (5.00 rating – 7%) or a reliable source (4.00 – 26%) of information.
- Twenty-two percent (22%) believe this is a very unreliable source (1.00 rating – 8%) or an unreliable source (2.00 – 14%) of information.

Reliability of Information Sources *(Continued)*

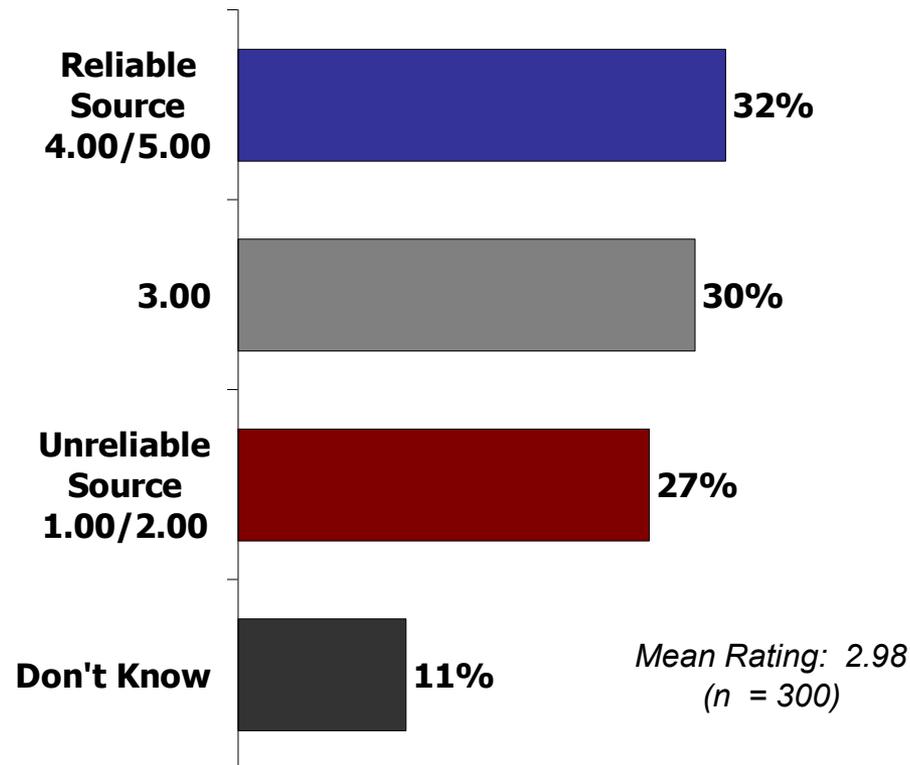
Local Business Leaders

- Twenty-seven percent (27%) believe this is a very unreliable source (1.00 rating – 10%) or an unreliable source (2.00 – 17%) of information.

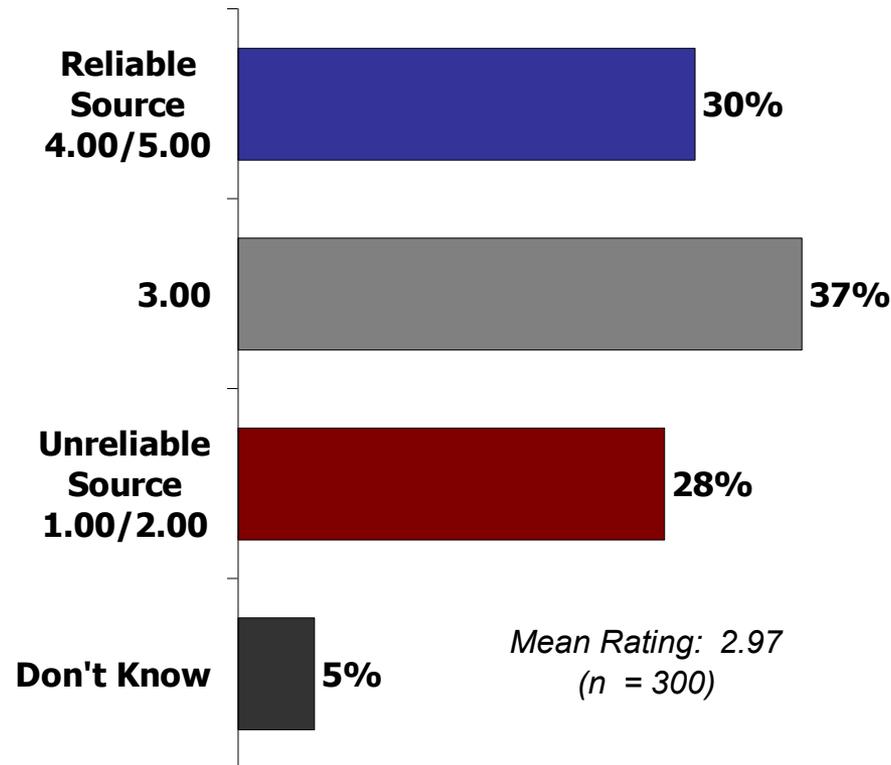
Citizen Planning Organizations



- Thirty-two percent (32%) believe this is a very reliable source (5.00 rating – 7%) or a reliable source (4.00 – 25%) of information.
- Twenty-seven percent (27%) believe this is a very unreliable source (1.00 rating – 15%) or an unreliable source (2.00 – 12%) of information.

Reliability of Information Sources *(Continued)*

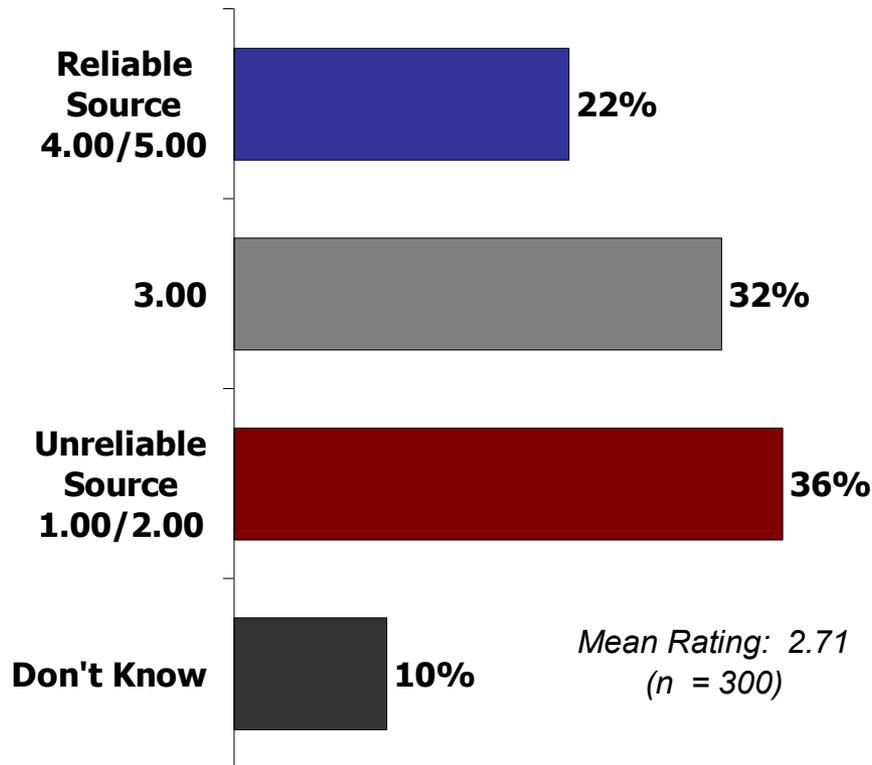
Newspapers



- Thirty percent (30%) believe this is a very reliable source (5.00 rating – 8%) or a reliable source (4.00 – 22%) of information.
- Twenty-eight percent (28%) believe this is a very unreliable source (1.00 rating – 14%) or an unreliable source (2.00 – 14%) of information.

County Commissioners



- Twenty-two percent (22%) believe this is a very reliable source (5.00 rating – 4%) or a reliable source (4.00 – 18%) of information.
- Thirty-six percent (36%) believe this is a very unreliable source (1.00 rating – 17%) or an unreliable source (2.00 – 19%) of information.
